Dear Mr. President:

Thank you for standing with American workers, manufacturers, and innovators in making clear that your administration does not support measures to weaken intellectual property rights in the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change negotiations.

As you know, some countries have suggested including measures to weaken intellectual property rights in the negotiations. We would oppose any such measures vigorously.

We believe intellectual property protections and the incentives they provide for the development of innovative technologies lie at the heart of America's competitiveness. Intellectual property rights allow innovators to attract the investment needed to develop and market their ideas, promoting economic growth and prosperity and creating high-value American jobs.

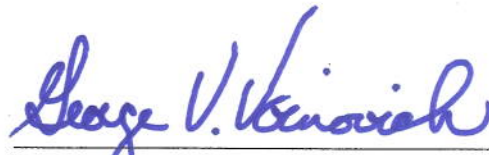
In recent congressional testimony, U.S. Special Envoy for Climate Change Todd Stern stated unequivocally that the administration does not support weakening intellectual property rights in the climate change talks. He further stated that the administration believes that the development of new technologies promoted by intellectual property protections will be central to addressing climate change. And in recent public remarks, United States Trade Representative Ron Kirk echoed those statements, saying that the administration would not agree to weaken intellectual property protections in any climate change negotiations.

We applaud and share these views. Any weakening of intellectual property rights in climate change negotiations would undermine innovation and, ultimately, the U.S. economy. We urge you to stand fast in your support of American intellectual property, American workers, and American innovators during the negotiations.

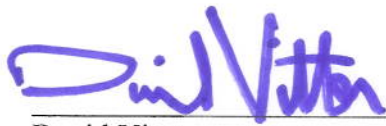
